FACEBOOK UPDATES:

- Neighbourhood Watch: Corkerhill and Mossspark established group: link to join will be added to facebook page – the more people who join, the higher the chance of us being able to purchase signs etc for lamp posts
- Lights that need replaced can be reported on GCC APP – it may take up to 30 days to fix a light.
- Tarside Flats noise; GHA piling – within regulated hours and will continue for a few more weeks until the work is finished.

NEW BUSINESS

- Is there anything that we can do to stop people parking on the grass? ?

- Corkerhill Park and the old Cart area: could this area be fenced off for dog walking
- Grass cutting - sometimes the grass is not being cut due to dog dirt
- Park maintenance – not emptying bins in the park
- Corkerhill – rear end of the play park – all sorted.
- Hydroponic sign has been removed

COUNCILLOR UPDATES:

Councillor Alex Wilson:

- Summer Sessions - there will be three nights – two more in addition to Kendrick Lamar.
- Met with new Pastor of church, Scott Hamilton: all sounded very positive. To attend March meeting. Would like to get involved with youth engagement – youth groups/food bank. First service 3rd March – everyone invited. Guides, Brownies still in the building. Sorry that the Drama Group has had to move

but will be invited back.

- To arrange pop up street surgeries – will let us know dates and locations.
- Arisaig Drive: to be resurfaced.
- Grit depot: Scott Downie – to do additional work to put in additional bins to allow NIV to grit the area
- Met with college: people running across Corkerhill Road: College have agreed to communicate issue to students
- Traffic Order put back until after the summer/Aug/Sept. Double yellows to be put on Mossspark Drive on college side.
- Alzheimers Bus: Great initiative from Susan Donnelly at South Cardonald CC. Raising awareness: happy to come into our area. Looking for volunteers for fundraising – three councillors to do zip slide.
- Simon community (for people in the process of being rehomed): Will take any donations. Near London Road
- Cardonald Cemetary Wall: Work to commence by March to have the wall reinstated. Work being done to encourage the whole wall to be done.

Councillor Elaine McSporrان:

- Site visits re roads, bins and litter
- Bins put in Ardhill and targeted enforcement as a result of complaints of dog poo – they need reports of times/areas etc makes it easier to monitor
- Bellahouston Spring 2018 - new layout and more parking etc etc
- Corkerhill Neighbourhood Hall: AGM attended by all councillors. Once all four councillors have backed they will take action again. Council currently subsidising hall. Hall just needs a lick of paint and a new interested party/core tenant willing to run it as viable concern as a voluntary basis.
- Enquiries re Next bike station: Data re usage of other stations has been requested. Funding available from Harvest Church and Baptist. Poll to be put on facebook page re venue for new station.

Jim Kavanagh:

- Nethercraigs litter is a major problem.
- Sports facilities – football and rugby mainly. Nethercraigs Tier 1 facility: secondhand equipment and not maintained: issues with maintenance of the grounds. Agreed to attend to it.
- Hill at Corkerhill – address as a one off within the 14 days.
- Mossspark: Lighting, potholes.
- Boyne Parade: Spoke to Steven Scott. Glasgow Green have had enough of parade. Plan to alternate Glasgow Green and Bellahouston. Denise Hamilton: Bellahouston events and Kevin Lammie from police. Event will be well policed – half an hour in the park. Enter from Bellahouston Drive. Event organisers will pick up all their own litter and have their own stewards. Hangers on are often the problem and they will pick these people up – police very experienced about managing this. Peoples experience is different to what

the police are assuring us of. 10 years ago was the last march in Bellahouston. Councillor Coleman: Change to alternating Bellahouston/Glasgow Green – suitability for size, policing and crowd containment.

- Indian Restaurant in the park: 2nd January – shut until further notice. Under private ownership. Nothing the council can do about the property under disrepair.
- Electric charging points: In Cardonald Ward=0 at present. Talks started to discuss charging points in our area.

The chair closed the meeting and thanked everyone for attending.
