- it was decided that Monday evenings were most suitable for the majority of members, however Corkerhill Community Hall is unavailable

COUNCILLORS

Councillor Elaine McSparran (not in attendance, however report submitted before meeting)

- Raised the issue regarding parking on the grass and we are currently looking into ways we can find a resolution as in some cases there is no quick fix.
- Myself and Councillor Wilson visited Corkerhill with a Council Officer to discuss the issues of litter and condition of the lane leading to Pollok Park. I am pleased to say that within an hour of our visit the fly tipping and general litter was removed. There is minimal soil on the verge and it is not possible to install drainage, or to fork the area to assist with the water draining away. There are also several electricity cables beneath the area at both the top and bottom of the verge where a soakaway could possibly have been installed so will look at alternative drainage solutions. The local team will check the path for water and detritus each time the play area is inspected, which is up 4 times per week. During cold weather, the path will be gritted and I can confirm this was carried out this morning.
- Data received regarding a Nextbike station has been received and will forward this to you. A good location would be close to Corkerhill train station as this would serve surrounding communities Mossbank, Cardonald and Pollok including Clyde College and those using Pollok Park. If this is something we can take forward it would be good to look at avenues of funding and sponsors to help raise the costs. I can provide more information on this next month for costs and appropriate steps required.
- Traffic plan is moving forward and covering all aspects of the legalities we would expect this to start soon for work to commence in the Summer.
- Summer Sessions first engagement meeting takes place on 28 th March within Govan Police Station. So far Kendrick Lemar is the confirmed act but there will at least two
- Awaiting information on bus shelter for Mossbank Square to know if this is even a possibility
- The gates at Nethercraigs have not been locked resulting in some youths gathering with cars revving engines and playing loud music. This has been passed on to Glasgow Life to address with the duty officers to ensure the gates are locked after the building has cleared for the evening
- Corkerhill Neighbourhood Hall is currently being reviewed by council officers and an update can hopefully be provided at next month's meeting
- Mossbank Baptist Church were awarded funding to enable them to place a container on the grounds to provide extra space for the Foodbank and install fridge/freezers to allow them to offer a wider variety of foods which are fresher and more perishable. An update will be provided once this is in place and further feedback has been given.
